

Getting started with Adobe® Reader®

Adobe Reader is the gold standard for reliably viewing PDF documents on iPhones and iPads.

Let's take a look at the ways you can use PDF documents with Adobe Reader.

Swipe to the next page to get started!



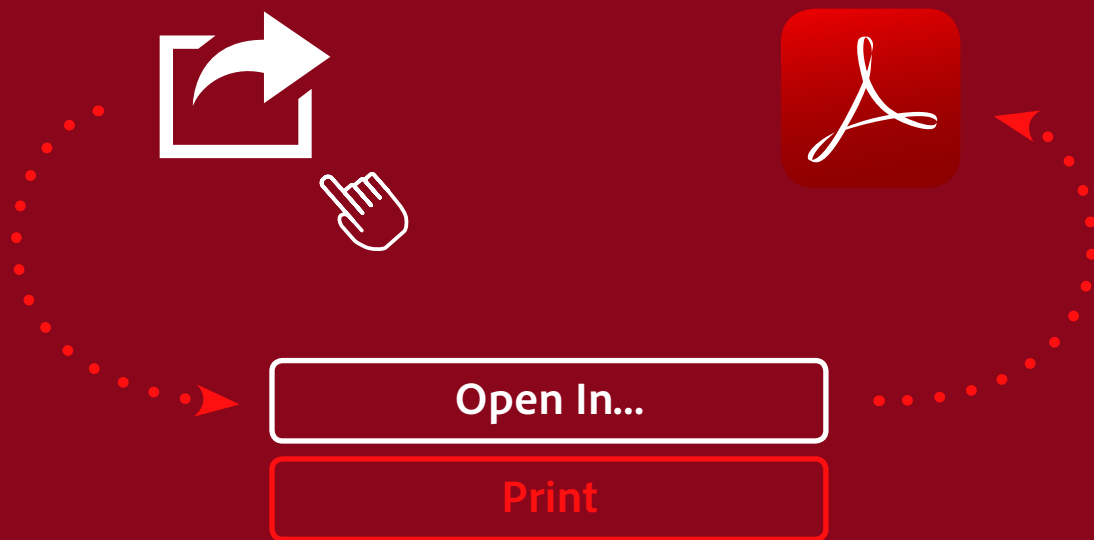
I have PDF documents in Mail and bookmarked in Safari, plus a whole bunch more in other apps.

How do I open them with Adobe Reader?

Opening PDF documents with Adobe Reader is as simple as tapping your finger. Swipe ahead to see how.

Mail

In Mail, tap the  button in the top bar and then tap **Open In**. Easy!



Safari

In Safari, tap the **Open In** button in the top bar. Easier!

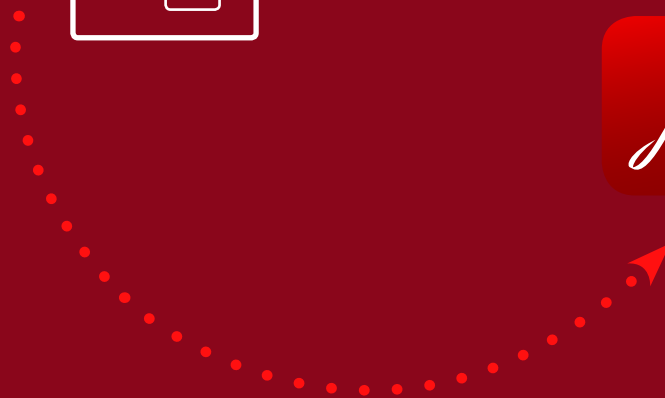

If your PDF document is in another app that uses the **Open In** button, tap the button to open the PDF document in Adobe Reader.




My PDF documents
are in Adobe Reader.
Now what do I do?

Tap the middle of the screen once to
reveal the toolbars. After a few moments,
they disappear until you tap again.



How do I get from one page to another?

Tap the document icon  in the toolbar to change how you view pages. Go with the flow or view one page at a time!



In **Continuous**, swipe up or down on the screen to change pages.



In **Single Page**, swipe left or right to change pages. Or tap the right or left edge. Go ahead, try it now!

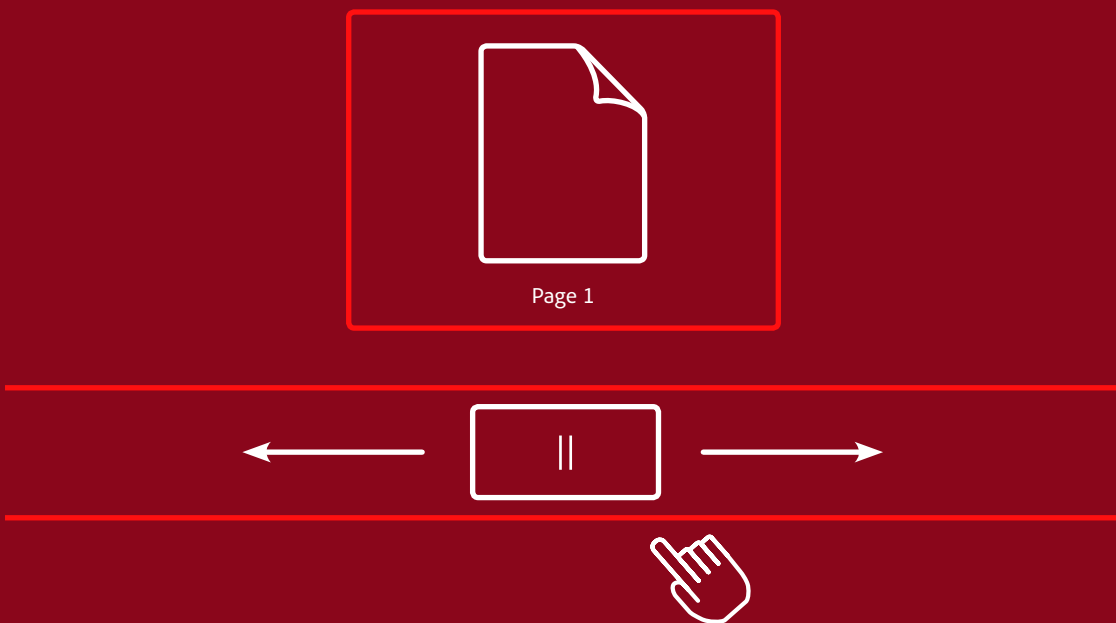


Get right to the point with document scrubbing.

When your PDF document has five or more pages, a handy scrubber bar appears at the bottom of the screen.

Remember to tap the middle of the screen to bring up the toolbars.

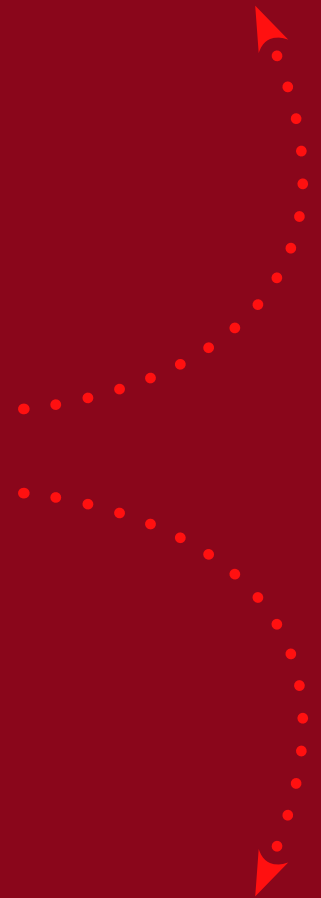
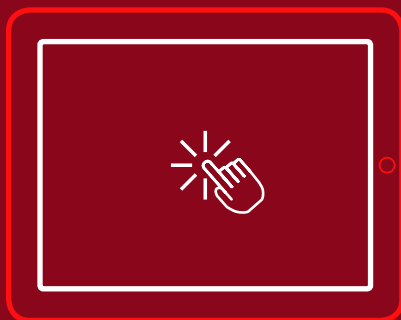


Try it yourself.

Take a moment to see how easy it is to navigate PDF documents in Adobe Reader.

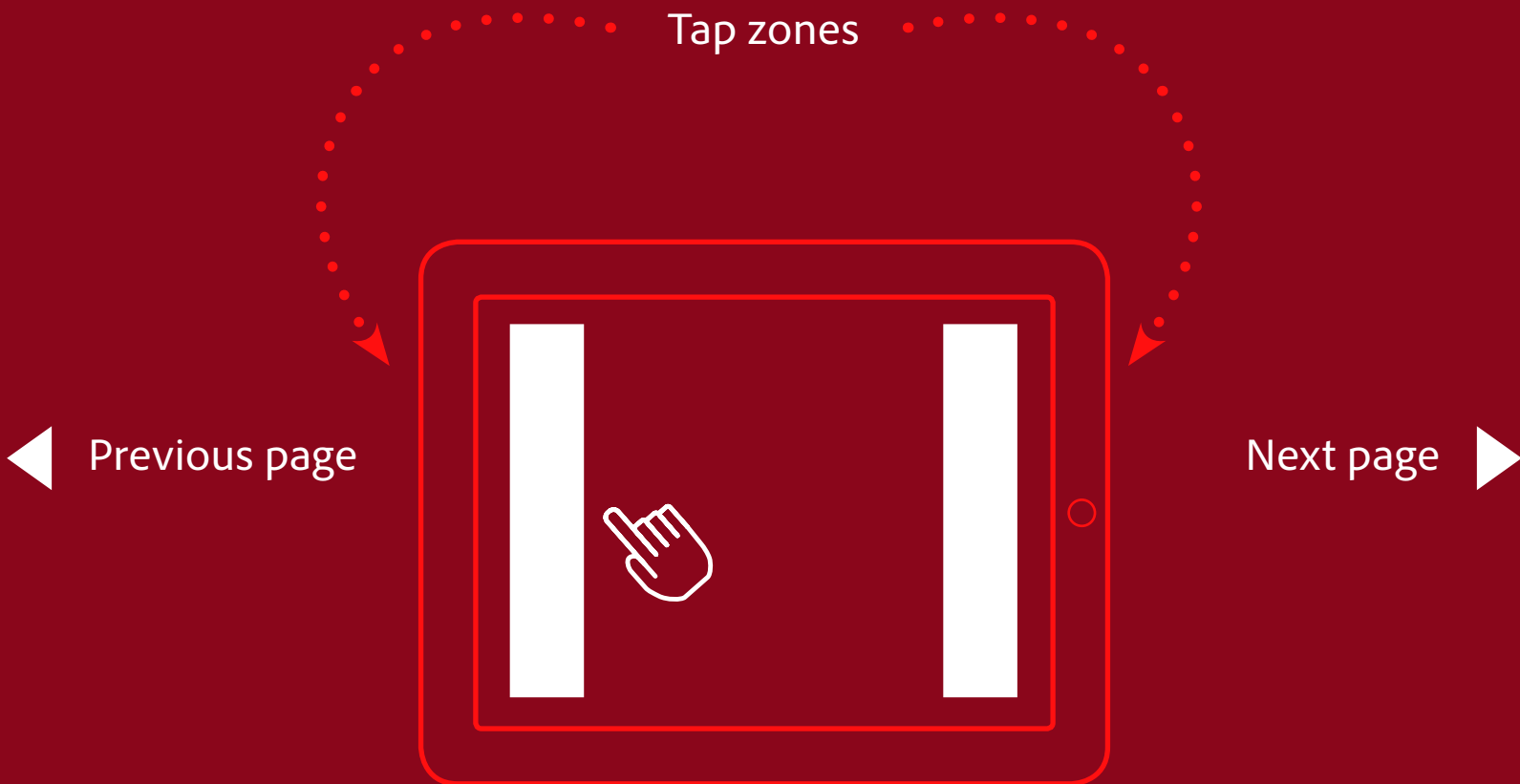
Try out the different viewing modes and scrubber bar.

In the zone

In **Single Page**, use the tap zones on the left and right edges of the screen to jump backward and forward.



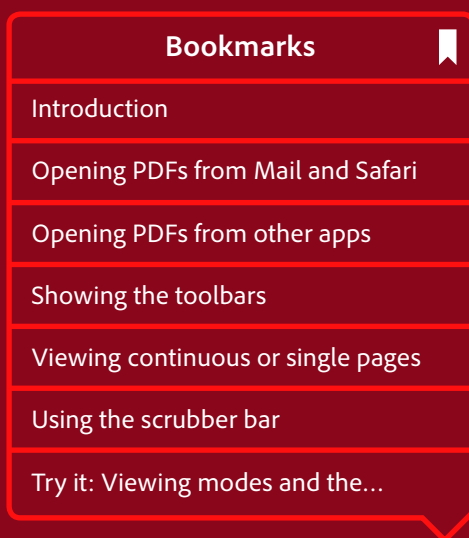
Remember: Tap the document icon  in the toolbar to switch to Single Page.

How can I jump to a specific chapter in my PDF document?


Bookmarks in Adobe Reader make it easy to get to where you want to go.



If a PDF document has bookmarks already built in, the bookmark icon appears in the bottom right corner. Try it now!



How do I add comments and annotations to my document?

Tap the annotation icon  to add notes, text, or simple freehand line drawings to your PDF document. You can even change the color, size, transparency, and line weights of your annotations.

Tip: Press and hold for a brief moment to add annotations without selecting the annotation icon .



How do I fill out forms in my PDF document?

You can easily fill out forms in Adobe Reader. Tap any text field in your PDF document and begin typing. You can also select radio buttons and checkboxes by tapping them.
